
HOWRAH

Overall scenario of the district

Howrah district, situated in South Bengal, is one of the prominent business districts of West Bengal. It is the second smallest district of West Bengal after Kolkata with an area of 1,467 sq km. It is surrounded by five important districts like Kolkata, North 24 Parganas on the east, South 24 Parganas on the east, Hooghly on the north, Midnapore East on the south, & Midnapore West on the west



Often termed as Sheffield of the East, Howrah is known today as an engineering hub, mainly in the area of light engineering industry. Due to presence of railways, roadways and waterways at the same time this district has huge location wise advantage compared to others. As per District Statistical Handbook, 2009

The district ranks 4th in terms of literacy rate and 2nd in terms of population density among all other districts of West Bengal.

District Profile:

Population:

According to Census Data (2011), the Total Population of the district is 48, 41,638 out of which there are 25,02,453 males (51.69%) & 23,39,185 females (48.31%). Out of a total 640 districts in India, Hooghly is ranked 23rd in terms of population. The population density in the district is 3300 persons per sq km.

Some of the major areas in terms of density of population (according to 2001 census) are:





It has been observed that one of the major sources of water for food processing units in West Bengal is ground water.


Blocks with average depth of ground water more than 9 meters during April, 2011 are:

Investment opportunities:

- The district has a poor raw material base but biggest strength is its strategic location.
- > A stand alone fruit processing unit can be set up in the district. A DPR on this project has already been prepared in this line by the Department of food Processing Industries & Horticulture.
- > 2-3 mushroom processing centres supported with proper laboratory and raw material base can be considered. It has been observed that intake of mushroom is prevalent in urban area compare to rural area. Moreover the huge need of hotel and restaurants of Kolkata can be catered by this unit.
- The district is also ideal for setting up of modern meat processing units, which needs to be approved under APEDA to facilitate export of meat from the state. These units can source the raw material (Raw meat) from up-coming modern slaughter house in Tangra under Kolkata Municipal Corporation.
- Cold storage for sweet water fish preservation.
