Overall scenario of the district

Bankura district is situated in the central point of south Bengal. On the south-east it is bounded by Hooghly district, on the south by Paschim Medinipur district and on the west by Purulia district.

The district has been described as the "connecting link between the plains of Bengal on the east and Chota Nagpur plateau on the west."

Population:

According to Census Data (2011), the Total Population of the district is 35,96,292 out of which there are 18,40,504 males (51.18%) & 17,55,788 females (48.82%). The population density in the district is 523 persons per sq km.






Ground water:
